

Thursday Electives - A Great Opportunity!

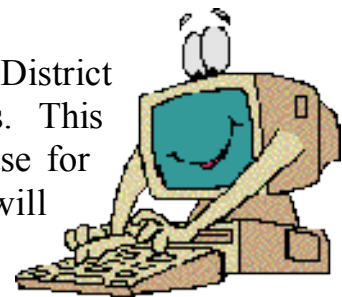
